
Waikato Respiratory Virus Report

18 July 2022

Influenza A H3N2 has peaked and is almost gone now. We may yet see A H1N1 or one of the two Influenza B lineages (B Victoria or the less common B Yamagata) circulate later in the winter. RSV numbers are doubling each week but we would expect a longer, smoother curve than last year. Several other viruses are also circulating, particularly Rhinoviruses.
